## The Stripping of the Altar

During the 7:00 p.m. service, while Psalm 22 is chanted by the choir (odd verses) and congregation (even verses), the altar is stripped of its paraments and linens. This is symbolic of the fact that after Holy Thursday and before His crucifixion, our Lord was stripped of His clothes. He was stripped naked that we who are naked in our sins might be clothed with His righteousness. Psalm 22 rehearses the humiliation of Christ at the hand of the soldiers as well as other themes of the Passion.
