#### THE FIRST READING

#### Revelation 7:2-17 (ESV)

- <sup>2</sup> Then I saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea,
- <sup>3</sup> saying, "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads."
- <sup>4</sup> And I heard the number of the sealed, 144,000, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel:
- <sup>5</sup> 12,000 from the tribe of Judah were sealed, 12,000 from the tribe of Reuben, 12,000 from the tribe of Gad,
- <sup>6</sup> 12,000 from the tribe of Asher, 12,000 from the tribe of Naphtali, 12,000 from the tribe of Manasseh,
- <sup>7</sup> 12,000 from the tribe of Simeon, 12,000 from the tribe of Levi, 12,000 from the tribe of Issachar,

## **CATECHISM FOR THE WEEK: The Apostles' Creed The Third Article**

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean? I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

Luther, Lectures on Genesis 13:8-9: What could Abram have said that was more proper and more conducive to peace? He puts himself on the same level with Lot and says: "Behold, we are kinsmen." Next he even lowers himself beneath Lot by letting him have the choice of where he would most like to go. Thus the uncle yields to the nephew, the older to the younger, the prophet and priest to God to the pupil – and all this to keep their love from being destroyed and to avoid giving occasion for strife. ... Because the whole world is engrossed in ambition and is profoundly wise, there is no place for love; jealousies, dissensions, and wars abound everywhere. Even though you do what Abram did for Lot and yield your right, yet peace cannot be maintained, not even if you should bear wrongs and disregard them. So corrupt and wicked is the world! It does not deserve this sacred teaching. Nevertheless, the pious must be taught and admonished diligently. After they have come to know God and have begun to believe, they must also learn how to conduct themselves toward their brethren, so that, following the example of Abram, they may yield their right. For the purpose of all laws is love and peace. To this end, all rights and all laws of whatever kind they are must be directed, although, of course, human laws are not to be put on a par with the laws of God in every respect. God's promise and the Sacraments allow no suspensions; for they are deeds and words of God directed toward us. He Himself wants to perform them if we accept them. Therefore, it is a sin to dispense with or modify something in them or change them, as the pope did when he withheld the chalice in the Lord's Supper. But since the purpose of earthly laws is love, they must be invoked in such a

manner that no offense is committed against love and, as Abram says in this passage, that there be no strife. Abram remains Lot's most affectionate uncle; and Lot, in turn, remains Abram's very dear nephew. But where the public peace is in danger, let love be the queen and teacher who moderates the laws and modifies them with a view toward lessening their severity. This modification calls for courageous and extraordinary men. As we can see, the teachers of the law do not debate according to love, but everywhere they stress the utmost justice and the letter of the law, as they term it. Hence they do not deserve to acquire this godly knowledge. But in the church let hearts be taught not to stress our rights so rigorously, but to moderate the laws in accordance with what appears to be beneficial to the community.

November 14, 2021 "Blessed or Cursed"

#### **READINGS**

Daniel 7:9-14 2 Peter 3:3-14 Matthew 25:31-46

The parables of chapter 25 might be called parables of the Church that illustrate the words of Jesus in 24:36-51. The faithful servant is illustrated by the words about faithful preachers in 25:14-30, while the evil servant receives the same treatment. In 25:31-46, Christ addresses the relationship of the hearers of the Gospel to those who are the preachers, the least of these His brethren. Here Jesus reminds the hearers that when we listen to the preaching of the Gospel, we are listening to Him. So we are called to treat the preachers of the Gospel in our midst as if we are receiving Christ. In 10:40, Jesus says, "He who receives you receives Me, and he who receives Me receives Him who sent Me." This is followed by a reference to a cup of cold water, even as Jesus speaks about in the parable. The blessed of the Father are those who have been called to faith through the preaching of the Gospel, even as Peter in 16:17. They are the wise virgins who have heard and believed. They do not consider their works, but living by faith, they have eagerly received the preaching of the Gospel. Their lamps have been filled up with the oil of the Spirit as they sought first the kingdom of God and its righteousness. Thus, though they sleep, their lamps do not go out, but they are ready for the arrival of the Bridegroom. They have honored the preachers of the Gospel, as the widow of Zarephath honored Elijah

(1 Kings 17) and the Shunammite woman honored Elisha (2 Kings 4).
