	2 Boxes	Crayons (24 Count Box) - <b>Crayola Only</b>
	2 Dozen	Pencils, #2 (Sharpened)
	3 Boxes	Pencils, Colored (12 Count, Sharpened)
	1	Sharpener, Handheld-Manual Pencil
	2	Erasers, Pink
	3 Sets	Markers, Washable - <b>Crayola</b> - not thin
	1 Set	Markers, Dry-erase, thin (Expo Brand!)
	1	Paints, Watercolor
	1 Bottle	Glue (4 oz. bottle) - Elmer's Only
	4 Sticks	Glue Sticks, <b>LARGE</b> - Elmer's Only
	2	Composition Notebooks, Primary (top half for drawing pictures, bottom half for writing)
	3	Pocket Folder (Strong and a size that will fit in the backpack, any color/design, horizontal pockets only)
	1 Pair	Scissors ("Fiskars for Kids" with metal blades work the best)
	1	Set of headphones in a gallon size Ziploc bag for storage with child's name on the bag. (Child should be able to take them on and off independently.)
	1	Gym Shoes (for gym use & safety of your child, non-marking soles)
	1	Backpack (without wheels, large enough to hold 9" x 12" papers and folders)
	1	Paint smock/paint shirt (make sure it is easy to put on, and please label it!)
	1	Ziploc Bags, Quart-Sized
	1	Ziploc Bags, Gallon-Sized
	1 set	Extra Clothing (including socks and underwear- <b>please</b> place in bag and label bag with name)
	1	Box, School (approximately 6" x 8" - without handles)

## Homemade Play-Dough Recipe

	Quantity	Ingredient
	1 Cup	Flour
	1 Cup	Water
	1/2 Cup	Salt
	1 Tbls.	Cooking Oil
	2 teas.	Cream of Tartar
	Drops	Food Coloring
		

Mix all ingredients together in a nonstick-coated kettle. **Heat** over medium heat. **Stir** until thick, then **flip** the "blob" over a couple of times in the pan to be sure it is dry enough. **Scrape** the Play-Dough out of the pan onto the counter surface and **knead** a bit.

**Store** in a plastic storage bag with a twist tie, then put the bag of Play-Dough in a Cool Whip, Tupperware, or other plastic container with a lid.
